



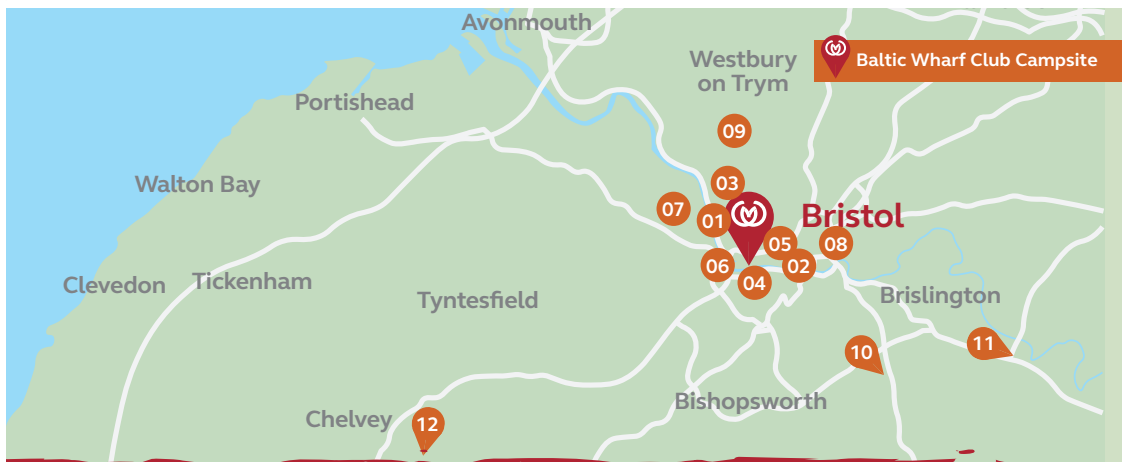

## Visit

- 1 **Clifton Suspension Bridge**  
The symbol of the city of Bristol, which has been attracting visitors for almost 150 years.
- 2 **M Shed Museum**  
A flagship museum with galleries, events and interactive exhibits telling the story of Bristol.
- 3 **Bristol Zoo**  
See over 450 exotic species on a fun-packed trip. Favourites include Gorilla Island and Asiatic Lions.

- 4 **Boat Trips**  
Discover Bristol by boat with spectacular river views.
- 5 **Hot Air Balloon rides**  
Take to the skies for a unique view of the city, see the sun set or rise or sample a glass of champagne while you fly.





## Walk

### 6 Local Routes

Follow the harbour and return along the opposite side, through Underfall Boat Yard. A gate at the bottom of the site leads directly to the harbourside walk.

### 7 Leigh Woods

Just outside the city you will find this glorious National Trust woodland with great views over the gorge.

## Explore

### 10 Longleat Safari Park

Get close to the animals at the UK's first safari park, or explore the house and gardens.

### 11 Bath

A unique city which combines vibrant culture with a rich history.

### 12 Cheddar Gorge

Nature, history, geology and breath-taking views are all on the cards at this spectacular site.

## Cycle

### 8 Cycling in Bristol

There are a number of cycle routes around Bristol, including the paths to Bath and the Avonmouth Bridge.

### 9 National Cycle Network

The nearest route to the site is 4, Greenwich to Fishguard.





## Visitor's top tips

|| Walk alongside Bristol floating harbour, pass by Brunel's SS Great Britain and stop at one of the many street food eateries in the Cargo area.

We walked the city trail and found it a great way to learn about Bristol's rich and varied history.

Take a trip on one of the many river excursions including the Matthew which is a replica of the 15c caravel that John Cabot sailed from Bristol to Newfoundland in 1497.

I used the city bike hire scheme to get around, they're all over the city and all you need is the YoBike app on your phone.

Spend a leisurely day in Clifton, home to many boutiques and coffee shops, pretty crescents of historic houses and Brunel's Clifton suspension bridge.

There are great street markets and flea markets on Saturdays in the old town.

The SS Great Britain is well worth a visit. ||
