2 Sudeley Castle & Gardens

The last home and burial place of Katherine Parr, with award winning gardens.

Birdland Park and Gardens

A natural setting on the River Windrush with over 500 birds from around the world, picnic areas, play grounds and more.

The Model Village

The only grade II listed model village in the country, replicating Bourton-on-the-Water.

Batsford Arboretum

55 acres of garden, statuesque trees, wild flowers and waterfalls.

The nearest route to this site is 48. Fosse 2.





10 Moreton-in-Marsh

An elegant and traditional Cotswolds market town, home to beautiful historic architecture and the largest open-air street market in the region.

11 Gloucester

Boasting over 2,000 years of history stretching back to the Roman period, this beautiful cathedral city features a magnificent castle, historic docks and lots of museums, shops and attractions.





Visits to Stow-on-the-Wold and Bourton-On-The-Water are a must. Both are really beautiful, vibrant villages.

The site is good for dog owners as the dog walking area leads out on to surrounding bridleways and footpaths.

The walk from the site to Salperton is lovely and very peaceful.

There is motorhome parking in Bourton-on-the-Water behind Co-op.

Moreton-in-Marsh is a lovely, thriving market town with so much history head to the bustling Tuesday market. Cleeve Hill offers excellent walking and stunning views.

The Farmers Arms pub in Guiting Power serves great food with lovely service.

The National Trust's Chedworth Roman Villa, Crickley Hill and Hailes Abbey sites are all worth a visit.

Drive to Cheltenham Race Course and take the Steam Railway to Broadway.

Lots of the pubs and cafes in the village are dog-friendly, and there is a beautiful park to let them run around in.
