10 National Cycle Network

The nearest route to the site is 55, the Rea Valley Millennium route which links Birmingham City Centre with Cannon Hill Park and King's Norton Park via the Rea Valley.

Walk

- 8 Chapel Lane Walking route
 About 2.5miles from the site
 you'll find Clowes Wood Nature
 Reserve, with miles of walking
 routes and Earlswood Lakes, three
 man-made reservoirs dating back
 to 1820's.
- 9 Hatton Locks


A peaceful location to watch the colourful narrow boats or enjoy a picnic along the towpath.

- 12 Coventry
 - Cathedral city, home to rich history and ancient legends. The European City of Sport 2019 and UK City of Culture 2021.
- 13 Royal Leamington Spa
 A spa town with stunning gardens and famous architecture.

The site is only 10 miles from the city centre, and can be reached by public transport.





Visitor's top tips

Becketts Farm Shop and Restaurant is a 10 minute walk and worth a visit. They serve great breakfast, plus Members receive 10% discount.

Don't miss Birmingham city centre, from the Bullring at one end to the Town hall at the other, visit the Museums, Theatres, Cathedrals, and the heart of Britain's canal network.

The market near the Bullring in Birmingham is a good place to buy fresh meat and fish.

The Transport Museum next to the site is great, particularly for children as the little train was loved by all.

Sarehole Mill a must for Tolkien fans.

Walk the Woodpecker 6 mile trail from the Lickey Hills visitor centre.

If you are a National Trust member this site is a must, there's so much to do in the area.

Visit Birmingham and Stratford-upon-Avon using the park and ride facility at Whitlock's End.

For cricket fans, Edgbaston is nearby.

Warwick is a very delightful town within easy reach.

Becketts Farm do great cookery classes.
