



Tintagel Castle

High on the coast, with dramatic views and steeped in legend and mystery as the said birthplace of King Arthur.

2 Museum of Witchcraft and Magic

Discover how a small medieval manor house was slowly modified into the building you see today.

6 Cornish Heritage Safaris

Visit sites of Cornish historic and cultural interest and explore the magic and mystery of Cornwall.

7 Trethevy' St Nectan's Glen and Waterfall

A short walk from the site this popular area boasts a walk along the river to a must see waterfall, with shop and cafe.

8 Rocky Valley

A short walk from the site along the coastal path this scenic valley and ruins of an old mill are worth visiting.

9 Local Walk

The coastal path borders the site and there are spectacular clifftop walks to be enjoyed along footpaths to Tintagel and Boscastle.

10 Local Routes

The Camel Trail is 16 miles from the site and the nearest National Cycle Network route is route number 3, The North Cornwall Trail, part of the Cornish Way.

11 Bodmin

One of Cornwall's oldest towns, Bodmin is steeped in fascinating history. Visit the famous and eerie Bodmin Jail and the 15th-century church, before soaking up the beautiful landscapes of Bodmin Moor.

12 Boscastle

One of Cornwall's most romantic places, this harbour town is home to breathtaking natural beauty alongside characterful eateries, museums and art galleries.





Visitor's top tips

The walk to Tintagel and Boscastle is stunning. The views are breathtaking.

There are peregrines nests outside site and along the coast, and you can see large auk colonies in breeding season.

Visit Port Isaac to see the Doc Martin set.

Walk from Daymer bay to Rock then catch the ferry to Padstow.

Trebarwith Strand is awesome at high tide on a windy day.

There's a lovely cafe at Tintagel Brewery which serves superb breakfasts with excellent-quality ingredients.

The National Trust's Boscastle Village is absolutely beautiful, with a harbour, cosy pubs and scenic walking trails.

The Port William pub offers wonderful food, great views and is dog-friendly!

We loved the bay at Crackington Haven, with spectacular views and wildlife, as well as a lovely bistro cafe and pub.

The walks here are absolutely incredible, but we would definitely recommend bringing sturdy footwear for the rugged terrain.

Head to St Nectan's Glen to see a breathtaking 60-foot waterfall surrounded by stunning woodland.
