4 Richmond Castle

One of the oldest Norman fortresses in Britain, with breathtaking views of The Dales.

6 Air Trail

High ropes adventure with an exciting assortment of rope bridges, tight ropes, cargo nets and swinging stepping stones.

7 North Yorkshire Moors Railway

Step back in time on the heritage steam railway, passing through the stunning Moors scenery.





Cycle

10 Tees Barrage

A 10 mile circular route starting from Tees Barrage, passing Portrack Marshes Nature Reserve and the Transporter Bridge.

11 National Cycle Network

The nearest route to this site is 6,
Derby to York.

Enjoy walks between Stockton and Middlesbrough along the River Tees.

9 Kiplin Hall

Woodland and lakeside walks can be enjoyed in the grounds surrounding this Jacobean house.

12 Durham


Historic riverside city with cobbled streets and world famous cathedral.

13 North Yorkshire Moors

One of the largest expanses of heather moorland in the UK, a must see for walkers.

14 Redcar

Seaside resort home to the worlds oldest surviving lifeboat.





Bring your binoculars, there's some fascinating wildlife to spot including kingfishers, seals and wild salmon.

Walk or cycle along the river to visit Stockton, there are good cycle lanes around the town.

Even if taking part isn't your thing, watching the white water canoeing is a fascinating way to spend the afternoon.

Seaton Carew beach is about 6 miles away, 2 mile stretch of sandy beach.

Visit Saltburn for a ride on the funicular.

Although the better known seaside locations of Saltburn-by-the-Sea and Staithes are a short drive away, Blackhall Rocks and Crimdon Beach just north of Hartlepool are also worth a visit for a nice stroll along the beach.

We like walking and Portract Marsh is brilliant for birds and wildlife.

There's a great shopping centre only a short walk away.
