



# WHITE WATER PARK

EASY | 10 MILES CIRCULAR ROUTE



## WHITE WATER PARK CYCLE ROUTE

White Water Park Caravan Club Site links directly to National Route 1 on a traffic free path which takes you to the start of the ride at the riverside. Starting and finishing at the Tees Barrage, where the adventurous will find the Tees Barrage White Water Rafting Centre, the circular 10 mile route runs along a traffic free path along the river.

### SURFACES

Grit-surfaced path. Can be muddy. Tarmac.

### TRAFFIC

Largely traffic free.

### SUITABILITY FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

Yes, but care should be taken and children should remain under supervision at all times.

### HILLS

No hills.

### REFRESHMENTS/FACILITIES

There is a café at the RSPB reserve which serves a great range of food. Just off the route by the Riverside Stadium you'll find Brasserie Hudson Quay which has fantastic views over the water.



## DIRECTIONS

- 1 Leave the site and go straight ahead onto the footpath/ cycle track opposite the entrance.
- 2 After approx 50 metres turn left and follow the path downhill to the river.
- 3 At the river, turn left onto the path and then follow past the Portrack Marshes Nature Reserve, a wetland that is home to hundreds of birds each year.
- 4 The route travels under the A19 and then under the Newport Bridge, taking you north towards Portrack.
- 5 At the roundabout you bear right and follow signs to Haverton Hill and Port Clarence, following the traffic free path to Port Clarence Road.
- 6 Midway along the traffic free path is a spur which takes you to Salthome Nature Reserve, where you will find a great cafe, three architect-designed hides, a walled wildlife garden and a dazzling array of wildlife. If you travel by bike or on two feet it won't cost you a penny - no matter how long you stay.
- 7 On leaving the reserve you return to the cycle path and turn left to the Transporter Bridge - the second largest type of its kind remaining in the world.
- 8 Once on the other side of the river you join Route 1 and follow it upstream where you pass the Teesaurus Park, a collection of fantastic steel dinosaurs. The ride then takes you back to Tees Barrage.

## DON'T MISS

“ Pub/restaurant at start/end of route we would recommend called The Talpore, or a good coffee/ cake shop at the Whitewater Centre also. The cafe at the White Water Centre offers 10% discount to Caravan Club members on production of their membership card. ”
